SOFIA (Stratospheric Observatory for Infrared Astronomy) is the world's largest airborne astronomical observatory. Hartford won the bid in an international competition. This award marks the second time Hartford Aviation has been selected to supply engines for the SOFIA aircraft.





The highly modified Boeing 747SP aircraft began its first test flights in 2007 and its first science flights in 2010. In addition to the 2.5 meter (8.2 feet in diameter) telescope, the airborne observatory includes work stations for scientists and educators. According to the NASA website, over the course of its planned 20 year lifetime, "SOFIA will inspire the development of new scientific instrumentation and foster the education of young scientists and engineers."
